PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN

1. That on the 25 day of March, 1976, pursuant to the provisions of the conservancy law of Colorado, there was filed in the office of the Clerk of the District Court sitting in and for Costilla County, Colorado, the petition for the establishment of a conservancy district to be known as the Costilla County Conservancy District.

2. That the proposed district is organized for the following purposes:

- a. Preventing floods;
- b. Regulating stream channels by changing, widening and deepening the same;
- c. Regulating the flow of streams;
- d. Diverting, controlling, or in whole or in part inundation; any incident to such purposes and to enable their accomplishment any district so established has the power to straighten, widen, deepen, change, divert, or change the course or terminus of any natural or artificial watercourse; to build reservoirs, canals, levees, walls, embankments, bridges, or dams; to reclaim or fill low lands and lands subject to overflow; to remove and to regulate and repair any of the construction herein named; and to do all other things necessary for the fulfillment of the purposes of articles 1 to 8 of this title; and such powers shall also be construed as purposes for which benefits may be appraised as provided in articles 1 to 8 of this title;
- e. The conservation, development, utilization, and disposal of water for agricultural, municipal and industrial uses thereof, when desirable as part of a project or undertaking the principal purpose of which is one or more of the purposes set out in this section.

3. That the lands sought to be included in said district comprise lands in Costilla County, Colorado, described as follows:

All of Costilla County located South of the following line: Beginning at the point of intersection of the Rio Grande River and the South line of Section 11 in Township 32 South, Range 75 West of the Sixth Principal Meridian; thence East to the Southwest Corner of Section 12 in Township 32 South, Range 71 West of the Sixth Principal Meridian; thence North to the Northwest Corner of said Section 12; thence East to the Southwest Corner of Section 2 in Township 32 South, Range 70 West of the Sixth Principal Meridian; thence Northeasterly along the top of the ridge dividing the Trinchera Drainage Basin and the Culebra Drainage Basin to Trinchera Peak.

To exclude that portion of land known as the Taylor Tract containing 77,000 acres, more or less, as described in the Torrens Book 8, Page 8, recorded in the County Clerk and Recorder's office of Costilla County.

4. That the reason for the necessity for the change in legal description of said territory is that it has only recently become known to Petitioners as to whether or not the Costilla County Conservancy District would encompass lands heretofore included within the Trinchera Water Conservancy District and that Petitioners are now desirous of amending said legal description so as to correctly reflect the intentions of Petitioners and to likewise reflect that the South boundary of the Trinchera Water Conservancy District shall be the North boundary of the proposed Costilla County Conservancy District.

5. C.R.S. 37-2-102(3) states:

"No petition with the requisite signatures shall be declared null and void on account of alleged defects, but the Court may at any time permit the petition to be amended to conform to the facts by correcting any errors in the description of the territory or in any other particular."

6. Petitioners' request that the Order of this Court reflect that the corrected legal description is the legal description to be contained in the Notice of Hearing on Petition pursuant to C.R.S. 1973, 37-2-104.
